PRECEDENCE – WHO'S FIRST?

- 1. SOCIAL ETIQUETTE takes into consideration SEX and AGE
- 2. DIPLOMACY & BUSINESS refers to RANK and LENGH of WORK

MORE IMPORTANT PERSON usually:

- initiates handshake
- · finishes meeting
- initiates business card's exchanging
- suggests informal calling call me Bob



GREETINGS

- in ancient times empty hand shows no weapon
- today handshake symbolizes respect and good faith
- in the past only man were handshaking
- in some cultures, it may be perceived as offensive
 & prohibited between men and women

WHAT IF I DONT WANT DO HANDSHAKE...BECAUSE OF COVID 19?

It is enough to specify why we behave differently

EXAMPLE 1

"Hi, forgive me for not shaking hands, but I avoid this gesture during a pandemi c."

WHO'S FIRST?

- at work if the same ranks, doesn't matters who is first
- at work higher rank goes first
- social life woman initiates handshake first
 (except countries / situation where it may be offensive)
- social life older gives hand to younger
- social life kids are waiting for adults

- 1,2,3,4 cheek kiss how many?
- air kiss
- don't kiss hand but...
- what if I don't want to be kissed or hugged...

extend your hand with a fairly stiff arm, shake, and step back



COUGHING AND Que SNEEZING ETIQUETTE

Mr. Zorba let me introduce you Miss Money Penny, General Director from Universal Export.

As well as men to women

INFORMAL SITUATIONS - SOCIAL ETIQUETTE

Mom, I would like to introduce my colleague Han Solo. Han, this is my mom Mrs. Spock.

INTRODUCING

- employee is introduced to a client
- if we have the same rank, take into consideration length of work
- during presentation add a few words about every person
- "It's nice to meet you Michael" repeating names
- "I'm sorry, but I didn't get your last name"
- if sb was introduced as Wiliam, don't call him "Bill" unless he says to
- correct mistakes ASAP but with grace it's Adam ©
